

Enjoy the show and see you next fall!

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
# Director's Notes Anita Smith

#### Welcome to The Birds and the Bees!

When I was first approached about directing this piece, there were two things that I was really excited about – the script, and the chance to work on a piece that featured all the locations that have been meaningful in my life (Rural SK, Regina, and Saskatoon). I grew up on a ranch in southwestern Saskatchewan, and while I (and my parents) knew that farm-livin' was not the life for me, the rural life featured in this production feels like home. I went to university, saw my first professional theatre production, met my husband in Regina (home of The Globe Theatre, as you know), and I am raising my family in Saskatoon (home of Persephone Theatre, the coproduction partner of this show). So, I feel very fortunate to have all three of these locations brought together in this one production.

Mark Crawford has written a laugh-out-loud script, featuring many sexy scenarios that turn into hilarious moments of humanity. However, this script also reminds us of the many wonderful things you can experience when you step outside of your comfort zone. The swager and bravery of Earl, Gail, Ben, and Sarah create such a sex-positive space. I hope we can all carry that forward into our own lives.

I'm so proud of the production that this talented group of artists have created for you to enjoy. I hope you laugh until your bellies ache and your faces hurt. There is no greater gift than a room full of strangers laughing. It has been far too long since we have been able to do that together; so, please laugh loudly, feel deeply, and have the best time! You are in for an absolute treat!



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This comedic romp through a local bee farm has a big heart to match the big laughs. Watch as mothers and daughters, farmers, and scientists come together in Mark Crawford's funny and flirty play about life and love. The action centers around Gail's farm: her failing beehives; her middle-aged daughter moving back home; her neighbour of 20 years, Earl, who keeps showing up more and more; and stirring things up is Ben, the young biology student who investigates the missing bees.

From the playwright of Bed and Breakfast, and being produced in collaboration with Persephone Theatre, comes a springtime romance just in time for planting season.
