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Creator's Note Rebecca Northan

The idea for Blind Date arrived in a flash - I experienced it as a "thunk" on the very top of my head as I was rounding a corner, on my way to a pitch meeting in 2007. Not in a million years did I think I would be asked to write director/creator notes for it over 15 years later!

"Mimi" has now been on over 1500+ dates across Canada, through the States, off-Broadway, in London's West End, and at the Edinburgh Festival. I recall thinking mid-pandemic, when we were all back in lock-down, that our lovely, lovelorn, loving French clown might never sit at her café table ever again. I am so grateful that Jennifer Brewin has invited us to return to the stage!

Blind Date is an ever-evolving, living, breathing piece of theatre that responds to the world around us. While there is a loose structure to it, we never know just how the scafolding will be embellished each night, because the details and nuance are brought to it by the Date, and their chemistry with Mimi. What IS consistent though is our love and respect for our on-stage guest, and the audience who has gathered to witness Magic unfold in real-time.

It seems now, more than ever, the immediate need for connection, a desire to be seen, and a longing for empathy and understanding are critical. The guiding principle behind Blind Date is an unwavering belief that everyone is loveable, and it is the clown's job to create an arena in which that truth can be revealed. Enjoy the ride - it is only when we gathered together that these sorts of miracles occur. Tonight, our aim is to have you fall in love with a stranger.
